

RULES

1. The Show is confined to members in Dumfriesshire Federation.
2. A member may enter from one Institute only.
3. All entry forms with entry money to be sent to Mrs Jane Hogg not later than 18th September 2020. No late entries accepted.
Entry Fee Individual 30p. per entry. Institute £4 per entry
All cheques payable to Dumfriesshire S.W.I.
4. Members may enter one entry only in each class.
5. All entries must be securely labelled.
Claim sheets required to uplift all exhibits, including team tests.
Each entry in Baking Section to be on paper plates – **no doyleys**.
6. Cellophane tops only for jams, jellies, curds and marmalades.
Lids may be used on chutney
7. Wine to be in standard **clear** bottles. Bottles to have wine labels and be corked. Wine will be tasted.
8. All entries may be handed in at Easterbrook Hall
on Thursday 22nd October between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m.
and on Friday 23rd October between 8 a.m. and 10 a.m.
Community Classes to be staged by members only, maximum three.
9. Exhibits may not be removed before 4.30 p.m. on Saturday 24th October and all must be uplifted by 5.30 p.m., otherwise no responsibility will be accepted by the Committee.
10. All exhibitors and stewards will need to pay admission money on their first visit when show is open to the public. No charge for readmission
11. **While every care will be taken, the Committee does not hold itself responsible for any loss of or damage to exhibits.**
12. **Articles must have been completed since the date of the last Show, i.e. 26th May 2018**
13. **The Judge's decision is final.** After judging on Friday 23rd October, between 4 p.m. and 5 p.m. approx., one member will be allowed to arrange display on Handcrafts Community Work.

Pattern for Class 50

Premature Baby Hat – 3 ply Yarn

NOTE – When completed, the rib is folded up to form a turn back.

Using 2¾ mm (12) needles cast on 111 sts.
Work in 1 x 1 rib for 5 cm, ending with a right side row.
Proceed in stocking stitch for 4 cm, ending on the wrong side.

In stocking stitch shape crown as follows:

Row 1:	K1, *K2 tog., K9, repeat from * to end.
Row 2	and every alternate row: Purl
Row 3:	K1, *K2 tog., K8, repeat from * to end.
Row 5:	K1, *K2 tog., K7, repeat from * to end.
Row 7:	K1, *K2 tog., K6, repeat from * to end.
Row 9:	K1, *K2 tog., K5, repeat from * to end.
Row 11:	K1, *K2 tog., K4, repeat from * to end.
Row 13:	K1, *K2 tog., K3, repeat from * to end.
Row 15:	K1, *K2 tog., K2, repeat from * to end.
Row 17:	K1, *K2 tog., K1, repeat from * to end.
Row 19:	K1, *K2 tog., repeat from * to end (11 sts).

Run yarn through remaining sts and draw up.
Join back seam, reversing seam for turn back.
